HEALTH SCIENCE 1000 EQUIVALENCY AT COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Health Science 1000 is a prerequisite for the <u>Bachelor of Science in Health Science program</u>. This course includes student success applications, Medical Terminology, and health careers. Currently, there is no single course equivalent to Health Science 1000 at community colleges. However, the following course combinations would be considered equivalent:

The other components of the Health Science equivalency must be met prior to the start of the second semester of the program.
