

# **Online RN-BSN**

### ROADMAP FOR FULL-TIME ONLINE TRACK

Admission to the full-time 12-month Online RN-BSN program is twice a year every Fall and Spring. The program is delivered in five consecutive 8-week sessions. Admission to the Full-time track is every Fall and Spring term. Courses are asynchronous online using Canvas Learning Management System. Community Health Clinical is the only clinical required and must be completed in-person at a community health facility.

### **Eligibility Requirements:**

- A current license as a Registered Nurse in California (A copy of your RN license must be submitted by program orientation; otherwise, admittance to the program will be forfeited.)
- Completed 60 semester units of baccalaureate-level transferable college credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Completed an AD or Diploma in nursing with a grade of C or better in each course
- The following prerequisites must be completed prior to admission to the program with a C or better in each

Oral Communication/Speech Chemistry
Written English Composition Microbiology
Critical Thinking/Logic Anatomy
Statistics (must be at least 3 semester units)
Physiology

• Enrollment of coursework is contingent upon documentation of a physical exam and on passing a drug screening and a background check.

## **Graduation Requirements**

- Complete University requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree, (50 units minimum in addition to transferable General Education units.)
- Complete the major of 26 upper-division units.
- Complete 9 upper-division GE units,

#### Validation of Equivalent Course Work

In addition to the 26 units in the nursing major, the School of Nursing will allow up to 15 upper division units of validated credit for equivalent nursing course work completed in preparation for nursing licensure. Validation of these units will be allowed, by challenge, upon completion of the program (with all grades posted) and successful completion of:

NURS 3110 Professional Nursing RN-BSN

NURS 3000 Health Assessment

NURS 3600 Transcultural Nursing Care
