Program Roadmap for Full-Time Online Track

Admission to the full-time Online RN-BSN Program is twice a year, every fall and spring term. The program is delivered in consecutive 8-week sessions. Courses are asynchronous, online, using the Canvas learning management system. The only in-person requirement is the Population Health Clinical course; it must be completed on-site at a community health facility.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Current California Registered Nurse (RN) license. A copy of your RN license must be submitted by the program orientation; otherwise, admittance to the program will be forfeited.
- Completed 60 semester units of baccalaureate-level transferrable coursework. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 is required.
- Completed Associate Degree in Nursing.
 - o A minimum grade of C is required in all coursework.
- The following prerequisites, or equivalent courses, must be completed prior to program admission (a C grade or better must be earned in each course):

 Enrollment in coursework is contingent upon documentation of a physical exam and on passing a drug screening and a background check.

Graduation Requirements:

- Complete Stanislaus State requirements for a Bachelor of Science degree (50 units minimum, in addition to transferable General Education units).
- Complete RN-BSN major coursework (24 upper-division units).
- Complete Upper-Division General Education courses (6 units).

Validation of Equivalent Course Work:

- In addition to the 24 units in the Nursing major, the School of Nursing will allow up to 20 upper-division units of validated credit for equivalent nursing course work completed, in preparation for the nursing licensure. Validation of these units will be allowed, by challenge, upon completion of the program (with all grades posted) and successful completion of:
 - o NURS 3110 Transition to Professional Practice
 - o NURS 3600 Diversity and Equity in Healthcare
 - NURS 4240 RN to BSN Seminar

Note: The School of Nursing validates the coursework and Continuing and Professional Education (CaPE) will complete the process.
